Internship Summary:

The Ranch Wildlife Intern will work under the supervision of the Ranch Wildlife Biologist and assist in conducting wildlife surveys, controlled burns, tractor operations, maintaining game feeders, maintaining gopher tortoise release areas, ground maintenance and other various wildlife management activities. The hours will flex and include night-time work and occasional weekend work conducting game surveys.

Essential Job Functions (May 2019 into August 2019)

- Assist in conducting spotlight surveys to monitor white-tailed deer populations.
- Assist in conducting helicopter surveys.
- Assist in conducting controlled burns to manage the natural habitat for wildlife.
- Help build and maintain gopher tortoise release enclosures.
- Help maintain game feeding stations, hunting blinds and stands.
- Assist, as needed, in overall grounds maintenance.
- Other various wildlife management activities will occasionally be scheduled and responsibility to participate as needed is required.
- Maintain open and positive communications with all other team members and supervisors.
- Receive cross training in various divisions of the Ranch.

Physical Requirements

While performing the duties of this job, the individual will work outdoors in all kinds of weather. Hours flex. Physical strength is required due to hiking on irregular surfaces, lifting gear, game, water and land vehicles, etc. The individual is regularly required to stand and walk for prolonged periods. The individual must be able to effectively communicate and hear. The intern is occasionally required to climb or balance; walk on uneven surfaces, stoop, kneel, crouch or crawl.
